## 2010 Christian Service Award Dinner

The Belleville (Metro-East) Region of Catholic Social Services (CSS) of Southern Illinois hosted the 20<sup>th</sup> Annual Christian Service Awards and Benefit Dinner on Friday, April 30th at Albert's Banquet Center in Belleville. At this year's award ceremony four out-

standing recipients received the 2010 Christian Service Award, they are:

**Pastor Kendall Granger** is the Pastor for New Life Community Church. The philosophy of the church is one of inclusion and practicality. His goal is to repair his community by rebuilding families, and he's starting with the men. He teaches courses designed to support men in taking responsibility for and being accountable to themselves and their families.

**Pastor Camilla Weatherall** is one of the Pastor's at Deliverance Mission Christian Church. She has provided spiritual guidance, for married, divorced, single, and abused women. As a mid-sized group leader she is dedicated to providing a safe and sensitive environment geared for engaging discussions.

**Helen Fiedler** was a driver for Meals on Wheels for many years, served as a Red Cross volunteer and also donated blood. She was also a volunteer for the Ministry to the Sick and Aged, and has always been an active member of St. Teresa's Church in Belleville as a Eucharistic Minister and in many other parish roles.

**Fr. Osang Idagbo** arrived in Belleville from Nigeria in September 2008 and was posted to serve as the temporary Sacramental Minister of Saints Peter and Paul Catholic Church in Waterloo, Illinois, in October 2008. Since Father Idagbo's assignment to Ss. Peter and Paul Church in Waterloo there has been a definite change in the overall parish community. Children and their parents adore Fr. Osang.

## Program Addition: St. John's Day Care Center

Catholic Social Services has taken over the management of St. John's Day Care Center and preschool. The Day Care Center's mission is in line with our own, education is the right of all individuals, regardless of race, religion, economic status, or age. They care for children ages 2-12 years old. St. John's provides an atmosphere that

is safe and conducive to learning. St. John's is a state-licensed facility and hires only qualified staff. CSS will provide the administrative and financial oversight of the Center and allow the staff there to focus on their primary task, which is caring for and educating the children entrusted to them.

# Our Programs

*The stories below are a composite of the experiences of fictional clients. The stories depict how clients can benefit from the programs CSS offers. The experiences, while fictional, are similar to those of our actual clients.*

It all began with an unplanned pregnancy. **Caroline** was scared and had no idea where to turn. She saw a glimmer of hope when she found a brochure for the adoption services at Catholic Social Services. Caroline spoke with counselors from CSS to help ease the uncertainty she felt about choosing her baby's new family. When Brayden was born, Caroline knew the moment she placed the infant in the Morgan's arms, she had made the right decision. Caroline contin-

ues to keep in contact with the Morgan family.

**Justin** grew up in a single parent household. His mother worked full-time while trying to care for Justin and his brother. The constant struggle he felt everyday often depressed him. He began seeing the CSS school counselor once a week. When Justin's father returned to the home and became violent, Justin was sent to a foster care family until his parent's found the help they needed. It was Justin's experience in foster care that inspired him to become an employee at CSS's St. John Bosco Children's Center, a safe-haven for abused and neglected children.

**Dorothy** was feeling helpless when she could not pay her rent. She was 67 years old and she no longer had a source of income due to her husband's illness. Dorothy applied to be a Senior Aide at CSS. With the help of a CSS employee, Dorothy was able to receive job training and skills while assisting a host agency. Dorothy has now been employed at a local business for over three years. When Dorothy's husband required daily assistance, she turned to CSS once again. Fox River Assisted Living Center offered Dorothy's husband an affordable assisted living center when he needed additional care.
